





13th Baltic Youth Volleyball Championship for Sport schools/Clubs

REGULATIONS

1. Goals

- 1.1. Popularize volleyball among youth and improve young volleyball player's skills.
- 1.2. Determine the best Sport school/Club volleyball teams in the Baltic States for youth born in 2005 and younger.
- 1.3. To ensure friendly relations between youth teams in the Baltic States.
- 1.4. Give Sport school/Club team's international experience.

2. Competition organizers

- 2.1. The competition is managed by the Latvian Volleyball Federation and its youth coordinator Sandra Budkēviča <u>sandra@volejbols.lv</u>, Riga, Andrejostas 17,
- 2.2. The girl's competition is organized by the Latvian Volleyball Federation/Riga Volleyball School and the boy's competition by the Estonian Volleyball Federation/Tallinna VK.

3. Place and time

- 3.1. Competition takes place:
 - 3.1.1. 6.-8.05 2022 in Latvia (Riga) Girls.
 - 3.1.2. 6.-8.05 2022 in Estonia (Tallinn) Boys.

4. Participants

- 4.1. Participants will be the four best sport school/club teams from Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia.
 - 4.1.1. Girls born in 2005 and younger.
 - 4.1.2. Boys born in 2005 and younger
 - 4.1.3. Participating players must be registered with the sport school or club by the Latvian, Lithuanian or Estonian Volleyball Federation.
 - 4.1.4. Teams cannot be supplemented by players from other schools or clubs.
 - 4.1.5. Delegations consist of 14 players, 2 coaches, 1 team official and a game referee. (National category, 1 category).

5. Applications

5.1. The Federation's representative's signature guarantees that the player is licensed to the respective sport school or club.

6. Financial conditions

- 6.1. Competition organizational expenses (hall rent and awards) for the girl's competition will be paid by the Latvian Volleyball Federation or the organizing school/club, and the boy's competition by the Estonian Volleyball Federation or the organizing school/club.
- 6.2. Expenses related to participation in the tournament (travel, lodging, meals) are paid by the delegating school/club.
- 6.3. Federations cover expenses for their referees (travel, meals, lodging), except, if the National Federation has a different decision within the Federation.

7. Rules

- 7.1. The games will be played according to FIVB International Volleyball rules. There will be no technical timeouts.
- 7.2. Official game ball Mikasa V 200W/ V300W
- 7.3. Games are best of five sets.
- 7.4. ALLOCATION OF POINTS
 - 7.4.1. For all the rounds of the BYVC Championships, the allocation of points shall be as follows:
 - 7.4.2. BYVC competition standing is based on the number of matches won.

Points for won and lost matches are allocated as follows:

- a. 3 points for the winner 3:0 or 3:1 of a match,
- b. 2 points for the winner 3:2 of a match.
- c. 1 point for the loser 2:3 of a match,
- d. 0 point for the loser 0:3 or 1:3 of a match.
- 7.4.3. There is a tie between Participants when each Participant has the same number of matches won. In case of a tie, the standing of the Participants is established by using the following criteria in the following mentioned order, until the tie ends:
 - a. In descending order by the number of allocated points for won and lost matches,
 - b. In descending order by the set quotient resulting from the division of all sets won by all sets lost during the CEV competition,
 - c. In descending order by the set points quotient resulting from the division of all set points scored by all sets points lost during the CEV competition,
- d. In descending order by the result(s) of the match(es) played between them.
- 7.5. Net height:
 - 7.5.1. Girls 2.24
 - 7.5.2. Boys 2.43

8. System of play

- 8.1. Based on the ratings submitted by the federations (1-4 places), teams will be split into three round robin groups of 4 teams each.
- 8.2. 1st place teams (based on federation ratings) are split into separate groups. 2nd, 3rd and 4th place teams are drawn by lot into the groups.

Final play

8.3. Teams:

After round robin games in groups, teams will play Play-off's crossed semi-finals and games for certain places on three (3) levels as follows:

Level I - Places 1.-4. - 4 games

First Place in Group A versus First place in Group C First Place in Group B versus best Second place For 3rd Place – Loser versus Loser For I Place – Winner versus Winner

Level II - Places 5.-8. - 4 games

Second 2^{nd} place in Groups versus second 3^{rd} place in Groups Third 2^{nd} place in Groups versus best 3^{rd} place in Groups For 7^{th} place – Loser versus Loser For 5^{th} place – Winner versus Winner

Level III - Places 9.-12. - 4 games

Third 3rd place in Groups versus third 4th place in Groups First 4th place in Groups versus second 4th place in Groups For 11th place – Loser versus Loser For 7th place – Winner versus Winner

9. Protests

- 9.1. The Sport schools/Clubs coach or representative must notify the game's head referee of the protest after the game.
- 9.2. The submission of the protest will be noted in the score sheet within 15 minutes of the game's conclusion, in accordance with International Volleyball rules.
- 9.3. Protests will be reviewed by the competition's head referee, head secretary and competition coordinator.

10. Awards

- 10.1. The top three teams receive a trophy and a diploma.
- 10.2. Top three teams' players receive medals. (14 players, 2 coaches, 1 team official).
- 10.3. The best player from each team will receive an award.
- 10.4. All other teams receive a diploma showing their place in the competition.

11. Various

- 11.1 Every federation designates one referee to the competition site
- 11.2 Competition is organized according to the country's COVID rules
